# WSS MAINTAINS ITS HIGH ACADEMIC PROFILE



Since the last edition of the WATU Newsletter in November 2016 the school's academic results in its public examinations have maintained the high levels that we have come to expect.

Of the eleven students taking their A Level mock examinations in Geography, History, General Studies, English, Kiswahili and Economics: **3 scored Division**One and **8 scored Division 2.** These results are highly creditable but all students are working with their tutors with the objective of either consolidating their division ones or moving from division two to division one. We are all confident of their success. WSS was ranked 9th out of 66 schools in the Northern Region.

Of the 40 students who took their end of Form 2 public examination 9 obtained div 1, 13 obtained div 2, 14 obtained div 3 and 4 obtained div 4. An analysis of these results showed that those students who scored divisions 3 and 4 joined WSS only in Form 2; that is to say, they

had not had the advantage of a Form 1 WSS preparation. As with their form 6 colleagues all these students will be working hard to improve their scores in Forms 3 and 4.

Also very satisfying are the results of the Form 4 re-sitters. These are students who either have been admitted into A Level studies on the basis that they will work during their final two years on acquiring their missing O level credits, or students who have been admitted from the public schools after having failed to obtain sufficient credits. The principle here is that WSS believes in these students and gives them every chance to obtain the credits necessary to proceed to the next level of education. Over the past few years this policy has been spectacularly successful and continued in 2016: of 15 students 11 succeeded in obtaining the credits required for A level studies and 4 will be allowed to enter the A Level course so long as they continue to work towards obtaining their credits.

# **NEW TEACHERS AT WSS**

WATU Secondary School is very pleased to welcome two new teachers who started work in January 2017:

Happiness Atanasio (B.Ed) Mwenge Catholic University, Moshi, teaching Civics, General Studies and Kiswahili.

*Matthew Temba*, (Diploma in Education, BA. Education) Dar-es-Salaam. Mathew brings 15 years of teaching experience from one of the best schools in the region. He is teaching Physics and Chemistry

In addition the school has welcomed four young men from Don Bosco Seminary for three months of teacher training. *Emmanuel Simon Mbiko* is from South Sudan and teaches History, *Johnbosco Makao Wambua* is from Kenya and teaches Chemistry, *Lawrence Michael* is Tanzanian and teaches Biology and *Andrew Phiri* is from Zambia and teaches English. It is a reflection of the high quality of the teaching professionals at WSS that Don Bosco Training College chooses our school to train its teachers.


