A huge thank you must go to Mr Satesh Melwani for his donation of a small electricity generator and three five thousand litre water tanks. Both of these items will substantially improve the quality of living and working on WATU Secondary School's beautiful campus at Shiri Mgungani. Whilst the school does now enjoy mains electricity it is not always reliable and the few solar panels could not maintain a reliable supply. The new generator now provides emergency power which is especially necessary during the evenings for study. The water tanks

allow the possibility of giving the girls' hostel, on the neighboring plot of land, direct access to water for their newly installed shower and toilet facilities. Before they had had to carry the water to fill their own tank. As you can see the girls are very excited. The whole campus will now enjoy a direct supply of fresh, clean water. Mr Melwani and his son Rayan spent several days at the school in August and their visit was appreciated enormously. Thank you very much indeed from all the students and staff at WATU Secondary School.


